

# 5 THINGS TO ASK YOUR CANDIDATE ON FRACKING, LNG & CLIMATE CHANGE

B.C.'s upcoming election, scheduled for October 19, will impact the province's climate plan. It will help determine whether or not there will be an explosion of fracking for liquefied natural gas, which will undermine the good work we're all doing to reduce pollution. Every candidate running for a seat in the legislature needs to know this is an issue you'll be voting on, and we must ask our candidates where they stand on it. At public events, pre-election campaign debates, and over the phone or via email, please ask your candidates:

1. Do you support the expansion of the fossil fuel industry when the pollution from fracking and LNG is already fueling climate disasters all over the province?
2. How does the province hope to meet its climate commitments when it plans to double the size of its most polluting industry with multiple LNG proposals?
3. How would you prioritize the province's limited renewable energy — electric vehicles and heat pumps or LNG exports?
4. How would your government plan for the decline of global gas demand in the 2030s forecast with every International Energy Agency scenario?
5. What's your plan to make sure workers and communities who rely on the gas industry are prepared for the transition away from fossil fuels as promised at the last UN climate conference?
