The next BC election, scheduled for October 19, has huge implications, including for the future of old-growth forests. Every candidate running for a seat in the Legislature needs to know this is an issue we'll be voting on, and we can all ask our candidates where they stand. At public events, pre-election campaign debates, and over the phone or via email, please ask your candidates:

1. If you became part of the BC government, would you honour or walk away from the last government's promise to save old-growth forests?
2. How will you speed up actions to deliver the now overdue recommendations from the Old Growth Strategic Review?
3. How will you act as a champion for old-growth while in discussion with First Nations?
4. How will you ensure the protection of irreplaceable old-growth and prevent irreversible loss of biodiversity?
5. How will you stay accountable for your actions on old-growth forests and break the cycle of talk-and-log in BC?
